

Dear Perspective Candidate:

Thank you for your consideration in offering your services to the citizens of the City of Whitesboro by applying for a place on the ballot for this year's election to be held Saturday, May 4, 2024. This is an informational letter to aid you in your application for public office. The 2024 Municipal Election will be to elect three aldermen for a two-year term and one alderman for a special one-year term. Enclosed you will find an Application for a Place on the General Election Ballot and the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer form and instructions. Both of these documents must be filed with the City Secretary no later than 5:00 p.m. on February 16, 2024. The drawing for the candidate order for ballot placement will be held on February 22, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.

- > Application for a Place on the General Election Ballot
 - o All candidates must file this notarized application with the City Secretary
- Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Instructions
 - All candidates must file this appointment with the City Secretary (you may appoint yourself)
- > Fair Campaign Practices Act
 - o Filing this form is optional
- Campaign Finance Report and Instructions
 - o If less than \$500 is received or spent by a candidate this form does not have to be filed.
- Designation of Final Report and Instructions

To be eligible for a city office, a candidate must:

- 1. Be a United States citizen;
- 2. Be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election;
- 3. Have not been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court;
- 4. Have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities;
- 5. Must be a registered voter;

- 6. For an Alderman, have resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the city for 6 months immediately preceding the date of the election.
- 7. For a Mayor, have resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the city for 12 months immediately preceding the date of the election.

Important Dates to Remember:

	February 22, 2024	Drawing for a place on the ballot
	February 23, 2024	Last day to withdraw your candidacy
	April 22, 2024	Early Voting Begins at City Hall
	April 30, 2024	Early Voting Ends at City Hall
	May 4, 2024	Election Day at City Hall

APPLICATION FOR A PLACE ON THE GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT FOR AN INDEPENDENT CANDIDATE

Prescribed by Secretary of State
Section 141.031, 142.004, 142.005, 142.007, Chapter 202, Texas Election Code 9/2023

INSTRUCTIONS

An independent candidate must submit an application for a place on the ballot in the General Election for State and County Officers. The application must be filed with the Secretary of State for a statewide or district office; or the county judge, for a county or precinct office.

In order for an independent candidate to make an application for a place on the ballot for the General Election for State and County Officers, he or she had to file a Declaration of Intent as set forth in Section 142.002, Texas Election Code.

This candidate application must be accompanied by a petition that satisfies the requirements prescribed by Section 142.007, Texas Election Code.

FILING DEADLINE

An application for a place on the ballot must be filed not later than 5:00 p.m. of the 30th day after runoff primary election day, except as provided by Section 202.007, Texas Election Code.

NEPOTISM LAW

The candidate must sign this statement indicating his awareness of the nepotism law. When a candidate signs the application, it is an acknowledgment that the candidate is aware of the nepotism law. The nepotism prohibitions of Chapter 573, Government Code, are summarized below:

No officer may appoint, or vote for or confirm the appointment or employment of any person related within the second degree by affinity (marriage) or the third degree by consanguinity (blood) to the officer, or to any other member of the governing body or court on which the officer serves when the compensation of that person is to be paid out of public funds or fees of office. However, nothing in the law prevents the appointment, voting for, or confirmation of anyone who has been continuously employed in the office or employment for the following period prior to the election or appointment of the officer or member related to the employee in the prohibited degree: one year, if the officer or member is elected at the General Election for State and County Officers.

No candidate may take action to influence an employee of the office to which the candidate is seeking election or an employee or officer of the governmental body to which the candidate is seeking election regarding the appointment or employment of a person related to the candidate in a prohibited degree as noted above. This prohibition does not apply to a candidate's actions with respect to a bona fide class or category of employees or prospective employees.

FOOTNOTES

¹An application for a place on the ballot, including any accompanying petition, is public information immediately on its filing. (Section 141.035, Texas Election Code)

²Inclusion of a candidate's VUID is optional. However, many candidates are required to be registered voters in the territory from which the office is elected at the time of the filing deadline. Please visit the Elections Division of the Secretary of State's website for additional information.

³Proof of release from the resulting disabilities of a felony conviction would include proof of judicial clemency under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure 42A.701, proof of executive pardon under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure 48.01, or proof of a restoration of rights under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure 48.05. (Texas Attorney General Opinion KP-0251)

Executive Pardon under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure 48.01

Restoration of Rights under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure 48.05

⁴All oaths, affidavits, or affirmations made within this State may be administered and a certificate of the fact given by a judge, clerk, or commissioner of any court of record, a notary public, a justice of the peace, and the Secretary of State of Texas. See Chapter 602 of the Texas Government Code for the complete list of persons authorized to administer oaths.
